

THE HEBREW - CALENDAR -

The 15th. to the 21st. days of ABIB was the Feast of Weeks. Leviticus 23:15-22

The 14th. of ABIB was The LORD's Passover. Exodus 12:3,6,11

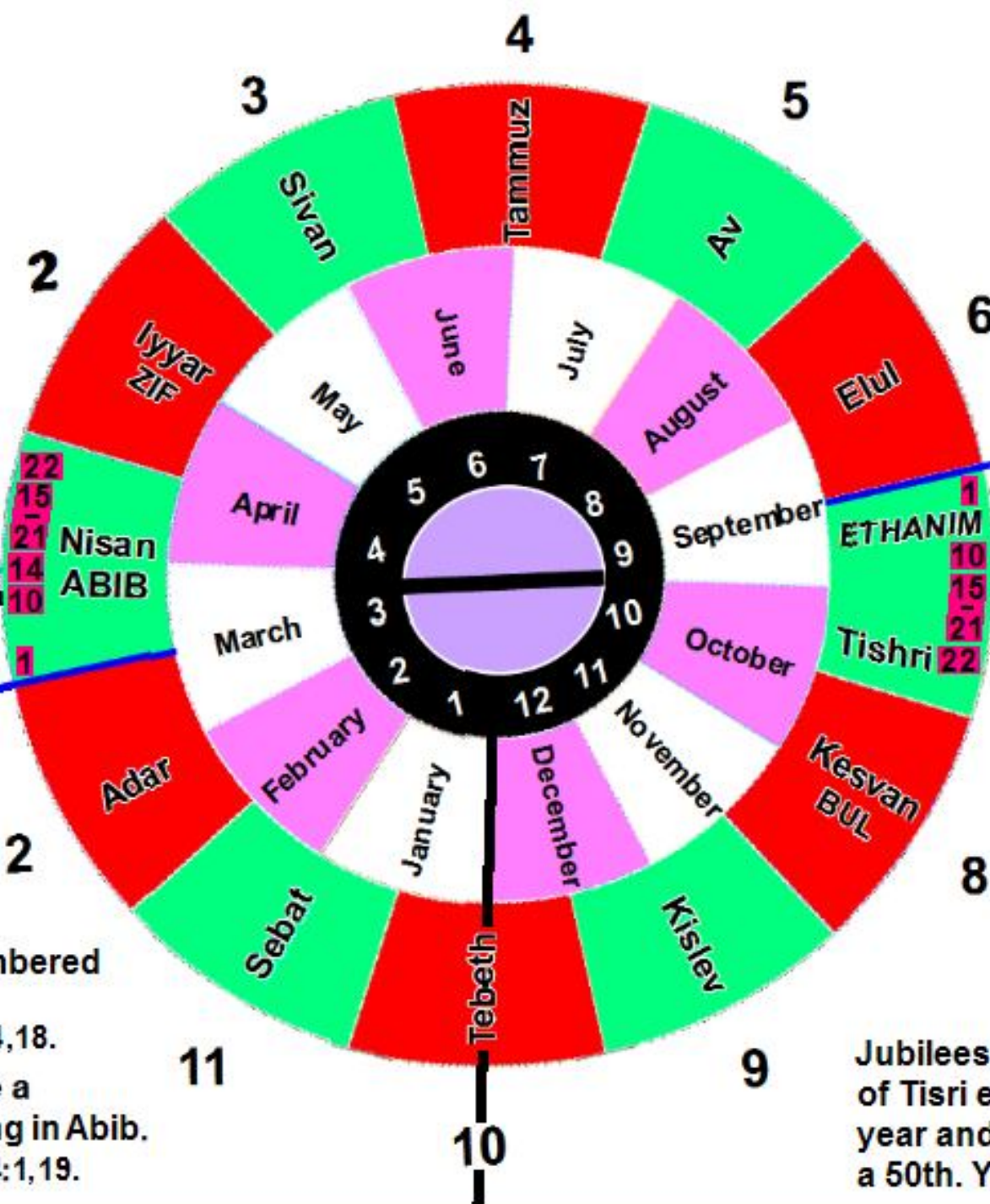


The lamb was selected on the 10th.

ABIB, also called Nisan, was the first month of the year Exodus 12:2, 13:4

Ezra and Nehemiah numbered months from ABIB. Ezra 6:19 & Nehemiah 8:14,18.

Every 7th year was to be a Sabbatical year beginning in Abib. Leviticus 25:2-4, Joshua 4:1,19.



The 1st. day of Tishri was the Feast of Trumpets Leviticus 23:24



The 10th. day of Tishri was the Day of Atonement Leviticus 23:27

Tishri 15 to 20 was The Feast of Tents. 21 was a Sabbath. Leviticus 23:33-43

Jubilees began on the 10th. day of Tisri each 49th. Sabbatical year and were to be regarded as a 50th. Year. Leviticus 25:8-11

IN SCRIPTURE, NO HEBREW YEAR BEGAN ON THE FIRST DAY OF THE 7th. MONTH (TISHRI). THE "FEAST OF TRUMPETS" IS NEVER CALLED A NEW YEAR'S DAY.
